In compound ordinal numbers, note that only the last figure is written as an ordinal number :

481 st	=	four hundred and eighty-first
6,211 th	=	six thousand, two hundred and eleventh

When expressed as figures, the last two letters of the written word are added to the ordinal number :

• first-1 st	\bigcirc fourth = 4 th
\bigcirc second = 2^{nd}	• twenty-sixth = 26^{th}
• third = 3^{rd}	• hundred and first = 101^{st}










In names for kings and queens, ordinal numbers are written in Roman numbers. When speaking, "the" is used before the ordinal number. Like this :


