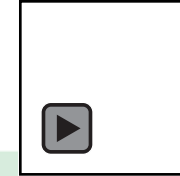

Margaret : It's too expensive. Do you give a discount?

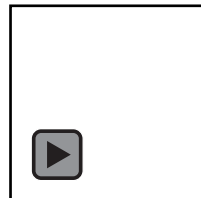
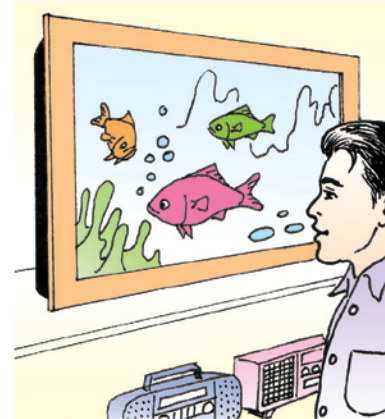
Salesman : Yes, ten percent.

Nino : I also want to send these two parcels.

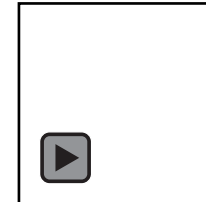
Clerk : Let me weigh them first. Well, it costs ฿30 each.

Seller : Here you are. Anything else?

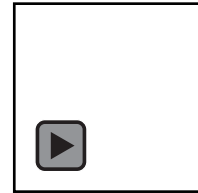
Laura : Umm... Let me think. How much are mussels?

Seller : No. This red one is cheaper.

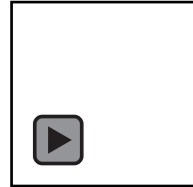
Customer : I want the yellow one. It goes with my pants.
